1. Introduction

_gid	Google Analytics sets this cookie to store information on how visitors use a website while also creating an analytics report of the website's performance. Some of the collected data includes the number of visitors, their source, and the pages they visit anonymously.	1 day	Analytics
_gat_gtag_UA_*	Google Analytics sets this cookie to store a unique user ID.	1 minute	Analytics
ga*	Google Analytics sets this cookie to store and count page views.	1 year 1 month 4 days	Analytics
collect	Used to send data to Google Analytics about the visitor's device and behavior. Tracks the visitor across devices and marketing channels.	Session	Analytics
